#### **PURPOSE:**

To report to the Committee in regard to the items which are to be approved under temporary delegation to Council. Transport for NSW (Transport) has issued a temporary delegation of its powers under the Roads Act 1993, to give councils an alternative approval pathway (separate from the Local Traffic Committee process) for specified low-risk works to make streets more liveable, and support walking and cycling.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Attached is a list of projects given approval under the temporary delegation to Council. The temporary Delegation gives Councils an option to carry out works on unclassified roads without prior referral to the Local Traffic Committee, provided other conditions are met. The temporary Delegation is in place until 30 June 2026 unless revoked prior to this date.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

1. **THAT** the information regarding Temporary Delegation to Council items be received.

#### **Consultation requirements**

Community engagement is not required. Community consultation was not required as there are no negative impacts from these projects. However, the community has been notified of these projects with no response received from the community.

#### **Financial/Resource Implications**

The cost for these projects is proposed to be funded from Traffic's LATM budget and Council's 2024/25 operational budget.




