5. General Business

1. Transport for NSW: Place, Design, Landscape Plan for WFU

The submission made at the recent CPC by SM was reviewed and discussed. The Precinct Committee noted its support of the motion passed at the CPC. Additionally a motion was proposed by BB and seconded by AA that: The Place Design and Landscape Plan fails to address the Condition of Approval E157 and that NSC is requested to formally request Transport for NSW provide an audit of the usable space available in the vicinity of the works and the how this Plan will increase the usable space as required by the Approval Condition E 157 and address the commitment for 2:1 tree replacement.

The motion was carried unanimously.

A further point was raised by CT that, only one of the active transport corridors separates pedestrians and cyclists. Shared pathways should be widened or divided to provide separate zones for pedestrians and bicyclists. This is a safety issue as high numbers of pedestrians and students will use them and e- bicycles can travel at high speeds.)

- 2. RF raised concerns that dogs are being allowed to defecate on the playing surface of artificial turf on Cammeray Oval. Parks Precinct would like to know what the NSC positon on this potential health hazard and if this is of concern, what is Councils position on policing this concern?
- 3. AA requested that Council consider installing a pedestrian crossing at the Grosvenor St. intersection with Ben Boyd Road, Neutral Bay. He indicated there is confusion as to whether the raised threshold is a pedestrian crossing.
