# NEW YEARS EVE 24/25

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

Three foreshore reserves will operate as un-ticketed managed-access vantage points this year. They are:

- Bradfield Park (including Mary Booth Reserve), closing to the public at 8pm on 30 December and reopening at 9.30am on 31 December
- Lavender Bay Parklands (including Watt, Clark and Quibaree Parks), closing at 7pm on 30 December and reopening at 9am on 31 December
- Blues Point Reserve (including Henry Lawson Reserve), closing at 8pm on 30 December and reopening at 9am on 31 December

You may enter and exit a vantage point until it reaches capacity, at which point the site will close. Bag checks will be conducted for prohibited items such as alcohol, knives, and glass.

Cremorne Point, Kurraba Reserve and Waverton Park will remain open to the public. These sites will be equipped with portable toilets and additional bins. Balls Head Reserve will be closed from midday on 31 December and will reopen 1 January.

Entry and exit gates to managed access vantage points will be as follows:

- Blues Point Reserve: entry and exit via Blues Point Rd
- Lavender Bay Parklands: entry via Harbourview Cres and exit via Lavender Cres
- Bradfield Park & Mary Booth Reserve: entry via Fitzroy St and exit via Broughton St

All other street and stairway access to these reserves will be closed.

Once a vantage point reaches capacity on 31 December, it will close and no further entry will be permitted, including for residents.

Inside a managed access reserve, you will find portable toilets, water stations, food outlets, and first aid services.

Bag checks will be carried out at the entry points of all managed access vantage points.

## Information for your guests

We recommend guests travel by public transport. Extra trains, metro and bus services will operate throughout the day. Plan ahead at [transportnsw.info](http://transportnsw.info)

If you live within a road closure area, you will need to meet your guests at the road closure point and walk them into the area. Only resident vehicles will be allowed into closed roads with valid ID.

Guests leaving by vehicle should delay their departure until roads re-open, usually between 2am and 3am. Police will re-open roads when it is safe to do so.

## Public transport

Buses will use different routes and stops while roads are closed. Trains and metro services continue. Visit [transportnsw.info](http://transportnsw.info) for details on changed public transport services.

The last ferry service to Cremorne Point Wharf on 31 December will leave Circular Quay at 5pm, and the last service from Cremorne Point Wharf will depart at 5.15pm. Ferry services from Cremorne Point to Circular Quay will resume from 12.40am until 2.30am on 1 January.

## Alcohol restrictions

**Alcohol free zone:** Streets south of Hodgson Ave, Cremorne Point, and Shellcove Rd, Kurraba Point will be alcohol free. Alcohol may be carried unopened to private property but cannot be opened or consumed on the street. NSW Police will be enforcing these restrictions.

**Alcohol prohibited zone:** All foreshore parks and reserves will be alcohol prohibited. Alcohol cannot be taken into or consumed in these areas. NSW Police will be enforcing these restrictions.

## Celebrate sustainably

If you're bringing a picnic, we encourage you to bring your own empty reusable water bottles. Water stations are available within the managed access vantage points. Please recycle any packaging and take your rubbish with you.

## Protect our environment

North Sydney is proud of its local flora and fauna. Please help protect our environment by avoiding garden beds and bushland and taking all rubbish with you or placing it in the bins provided.



## Road closures

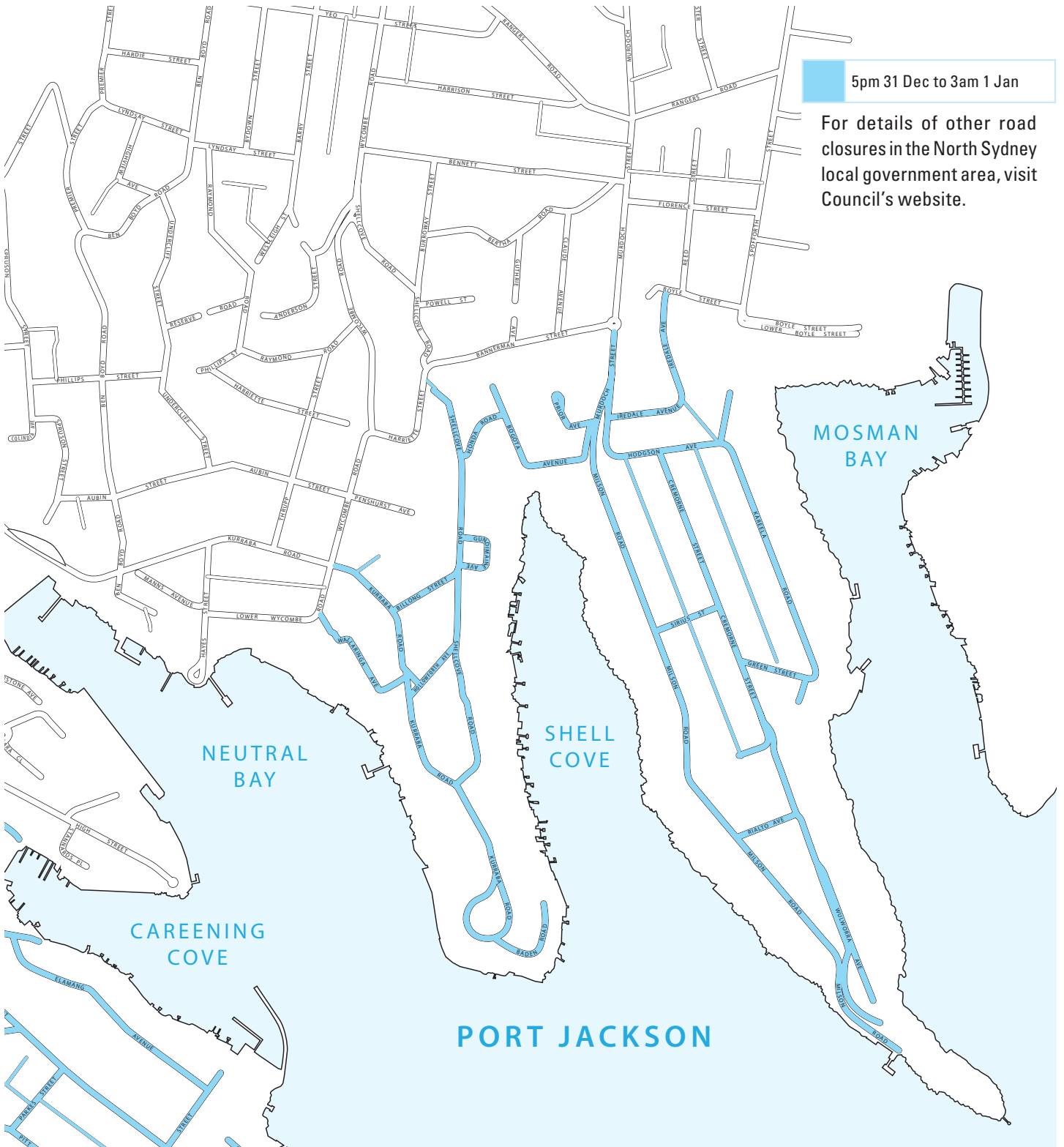
The NSW Police will implement road closures and may close roads or footpaths at any time for pedestrian safety.

Access roads into Kurraba Point and Cremorne Point peninsulas will close at 5pm on 31 December. Police may allow resident access until 8pm at their discretion. The closed roads are:

- Kurraba Rd, east of Wycombe Rd
- Wallaringa Ave, south of Lower Wycombe Rd
- Shellcove Rd, south of Harriette St
- Murdoch St, south of Bannerman St
- Iredale Ave

Residents should not use their vehicles after 5pm but are permitted to return to their homes until 6pm or later in some areas. You must present photo ID with your residential address to gain access to a road closure area. If you are returning home after midnight, you will not be able to access your property by vehicle until the roads are re-opened.

Please note that Fitzroy St in Milsons Point will be closed from 12pm on 31 December. Residents wanting to travel to Lavender Bay or McMahons Point will need to go via High St, North Sydney.



## Special event clearways

Special event clearway parking restrictions will be in effect from 6am on 31 December on Milson Rd and 3pm on 31 December on Bannerman St between Murdoch St and Claude Ave, and Murdoch St between Bannerman St and 23 Murdoch St.

Special event clearways will also be in place across other parts of the North Sydney local government area. You must not stop or park in a special event clearway. A tow-away fee in excess of

\$240 will apply. If your vehicle is left in a clearway, it may be towed to a nearby street. If your vehicle has been towed, please call 132 701.

Public buses, taxis, and other hire vehicles are permitted to stop when dropping off or picking up passengers. Resident parking and disability permits are not valid in a special event clearway. Always check signage before you park.
