1. CPC MEETING FEEDBACK

The meeting was duly updated.

2. COUNCIL FEEDBACK

[a] Bradfield Park & the Bike Ramp Issues- Impact on Local Amenity

Courtesy of Cr Mutton & Beregi, the last Council meeting RESOLVED THAT while the provision of a rideable bike ramp is and remains a high priority for NSC, Council will try to urgently work with TfNSW to refine the design; & that any final concept must address certain issues relating to Heritage, open space needs of the Local Community. & Council ask that TfNSW amend any winning design to avoid cyclists exiting the ramp in Bradfield Park North and address issues which funnel cyclists onto Middlemiss Street and into the roundabout at Lavender and Alfred Streets.

Precinct were updated on the Council' Public Information session held at Milsons Pt Station on Sat 19 Feb. **ACTION:** Precinct note and support the Council direction.

[b] New Councillors attend an On- site meeting @ Cammeray Park & Golf Course on Sun 30 Jan 2022.

Strong attendance at this event organised by Registry Precinct for the Save Our Parks Alliance (SOPA) with Bay, Parks, & Brightmore Precincts. Public attended with Crs William Bourke, State Candidate for By Election in Willoughby State seat & Larissa Penn, Independent Candidate at same By Election, Cr Shannon Welch, & Mayor Zoë Baker. Other attendees were Catherine Renshaw, Fed Labor Candidate for Nth Syd, Kylea Tink, Independent Candidate for Nth Sydney. Paul Walter, Chair of Bay Precinct addressed the Group and hosted the event and took them on a tour around the Cammeray Park starting at the Avenue of Meleluccas down to the Dam & round to the Clubhouse. [c] Feb 6th, SOPA hosted a CAMMERAY KIDS HELP SAVE YOUR TREES SUNDAY at 11am. It was a "Family Day Event- Save Cammeray Park Trees" organised by Registry & Bay Precincts. We organised a Poetry, Painting & Photo Competitions for the Children and it was successful event that was much enjoyed by all who attended. [e] Public Feedback sought by Council on the increase in frequency of Council Meetings & the cancellation of Committees & integration of their Work into Council Meetings &

circulation of Papers 2 weeks prior to Council meetings & all briefings being webcast to the public.

- **ACTION: Precinct unanimously supports these new initiatives and applauds them in the interests of open & transparent governance.**

3. WHT&BL Update & Feedback on Anzac Park Primary School issues

Regular Meetings restarting between TfNSW (Transport team) and RH (Anzac Park School) with GT & APPS P&C regarding preparation for continuing Early Works. APPS enrolments have now reached 1000 kids at a site that was designed & approved for 400 kids as a Landmark School. Precinct attendees queried how is the school managing this? Are they having longer school days, staggered times for recess & lunch etc. We will postpone this issue to next month when the APPS Rep will be present.

- MW advised that parts of Cammeray Ave had been closed off for months for the trenching Works but that is opening up now. Trucks still being parked but that too is lessening. They are filling in the holes in the Anzac Reserve and restoring the area. MA advised that there are many more trucks now being parked along Parks Ave midway down.
- **ACTION- Locals & Council need to keep a watching brief on these Works to ensure remediation is up to scratch**

Tara at WHTBL advised locals in a face-to-face meeting that:

- 20 items of vegetation will be removed in the coming days, and
- that the Noise Wall along Anzac Park will be either heightened or extended.
- **ACTION-** Precinct urged locals to be watchful, take photos and lodge queries or COMPLAINTS at the WHTBL email so they get logged for the EPA. This is ongoing for locals, and they need to be mindful to follow the proper process to be effective.

4. More Tree Loss in Rosalind Street Hill/Anzac Reserve & Anzac Park

- SR advised that Ernest St near Anzac Park is a devastation & decimation zone of tree loss, diggers, fencing & construction equipment. MA advised that there is also much construction work happening along the Cammeray Golf Course on Upper Ernest St /Park St side.

OTHER LOCAL ISSUES

MA raised an issue re the WHBL Noise Abatement Project not following up on replacing her bedroom window. She will forward information to be followed up with the WHTBL Team & their Contractor SLR.
