4a Precinct e-news

- changes to bus services (increasing frequency) were noted
- no reply from NSC on the previous minutes

4b – Council’s minutes

- a sculpture exhibition at Sawmillers appears to be probable in 2021.
- community access to documents not available via the website can be made. NSC has received multiple applications via the GIPA process.
- the Precinct unanimously opposed the proposed extended hours for the 168 Walker St. Aqualand project.
- proposed expenditure for the Primrose Park tennis courts (circa \$2.1m) appears excessive given the range of community assets that require attention. The precinct requests the merits of alternative projects be considered, including improvements to footpaths within St Leonards park. The stage 2 works in St Leonards to commence in Jan 2021 park were noted.
- the Berrys Bay work group was noted, with Precinct members free to volunteer to join by Nov 6.
- alternative swimming location during the North Sydney Pool renovation are being considered by NSC, a swimming enclosure in the harbour at Hayes street and or Lavender Bay
- 173 – 179 Walker St project: A planning proposal has been submitted and supported by Council. It is currently on public exhibition, and members are encouraged to make submissions before November 26.

- AGMs and voting for office holders deferred, per Council edict
- Victoria Cross - Blues Point excavation site appears to be finalised by Christmas, with concrete pours underway at the main site, and removal of the acoustic shed on the northern site.
