EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Tenders were called and were received until 4.00pm on Thursday 22 August 2019 for the submission of tenders to undertake Forsyth Park #1 Oval Reconstruction

In order for Councillors to discuss the content of this Commercial in Confidence report it will be necessary to close the Council meeting to the public.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Funding for this project is included in the adopted 2019/20 budget.

This project received grant funding from the Australian Government through Sport Australia. North Sydney Council were successful in obtaining funding of \$135,000 through Round 2 of the Community Sport Infrastructure Program. This funding will assist Council with the implementation of the improvements works at Forsyth Park.

BACKGROUND

Forsyth Park is located on Montpelier Avenue, Neutral Bay. Forsyth Park is classified as an active recreation sportsground and is used for a variety of organised sport and recreational activities including training and competition.

In the 2019/20 Capital Works Program, Council has allocated funds for the upgrading of Sportsground reconstruction of field 1 only. The playing field redevelopment is intended to correct severe undulations in the field, install new drainage and irrigation infrastructure. Install a new cricket wicket and renew the surface vegetation to be a single species of turf.

The rectification works will result in a significant improvement to the playing surface for sport. The improved drainage and irrigation will allow the fields turf surface to be maintained to a higher quality.

In August this year tenders were invited for these services on a lump sum basis. The contract will run over a set construction period of 8-10 weeks from date of contract.

SUSTAINABILITY STATEMENT

The sustainability implications are of a minor nature and did not warrant a detailed assessment.

TENDERS RECEIVED

The methodology adopted to undertake the tender evaluation of Tender 10/2020 was based on selection criteria outlined in the tender documents and in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 and the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005.
