Items will be considered at the Public Forum in the order that they appear on the agenda.

6. Members of the public gallery must turn all mobile phones to silent for the duration of the meeting. Members of the public are not permitted to make a video or sound recording (and/or any electronic device capable of recording speech) of any meeting, unless the permission of Council is granted.

7. Parts of this meeting may be recorded for the purpose of assisting in the transcription of the Minutes. The Government Information (Public Access) Act applies to the recording of Council meetings and, from time to time, Council may receive an application to release such recordings to a member of the public.

# Item 2: Ward Boundaries – amended proposal for 2020 election

Report of Ian Curry, Manager Governance and Committee Services

At its meeting on 23 September 2019, Council considered a report submitted to the Governance and Finance Committee regarding the Ward boundaries and resolved:

1. THAT Option 1 be selected as Council's preferred option for the revised North Sydney Council Ward boundaries.

2. THAT the NSW Electoral Commission be advised of Council's resolution.

3. THAT a further report be submitted to Council following public advertising of the approved option.

Option 1 made minor boundary alterations to the current three ward structure to ensure the number of electors in each remained within quota.

After submitting the proposed boundaries to the NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC), Council was advised that, due to the result of the 2012 and 2017 referendum regarding the election of the Mayor by Councillors, Council will continue to have ten (10) civic offices or councillor positions (including the Mayor) at the next election and not nine (9) as previously thought. As there must be an equal number of Councillors in each ward and the Mayor is no longer to be elected by all the electors of the Local Government area, it is necessary to alter the number of wards.

Council has received a cost estimate from NSWEC of \$491,557 (excl GST) to conduct the 2020 Council elections. This quote was provided prior to the advice regarding the number of councillors to be elected and is subject to change should extra costs be incurred, such as the preparation of new electoral rolls.

Council Staff will attempt to minimise the actual cost in consultation with NSWEC as more detailed planning takes place and bookings for polling places are finalised.

#### **Recommending:**

**1. THAT** Council note the advice from the OLG regarding the number of civic offices to be elected at the 2020 elections and the need to alter the ward structure.

**2. THAT** Council endorse the revised two (2) Ward boundary proposal attached to this report.

**3.** THAT Council name the proposed two new Wards North and South.

**4. THAT** The proposed two (2) ward structure be placed on public exhibition in accordance with s210(A) of the Local Government Act.

**5. THAT** A further report be provided to Council to consider any submissions received.

### Item 3: Corporate Advertising

Report of Sandra Moore, Manager Communications & Events

Council advertises a wide range of information to the community, including development applications, notices of meetings, policies and major projects and community events. Legislation mandates advertising for a wide range of public notices to be in a widely circulated newspaper. While the legislation ensured transparency in the pre-digital era, readership of newspapers is declining and digital advertising (often less expensive) is increasing. IPART recommended the NSW Government review the legislation in this regard, however, the NSW Government did not support this recommendation.

An internal review of newspaper advertising options has been undertaken. As the review contains commercial-in-confidence financial and business information, it has been provided to Council as a confidential report in accordance with Section 10A(2) (c) and (d) of the Local Government Act.

In order for Councillors to discuss the content of this Confidential report it will be necessary to close the Council meeting to the public.

Funding for corporate advertising is included in the current operational budget. Council currently spends in the order of \$225,000 per year on newspaper advertising to meet the different legislative requirements.

Funding for the project is appropriate.

#### **Recommending:**

1. THAT Council endorse the proposed advertising plan for 2020.
