1. Code of Conduct Statistics

Clauses 11.1 and 11.2 of the *Procedures for the Administration of The Model Code of Conduct for Local Councils in NSW, 2020* state:

11.1 The complaints coordinator must arrange for the following statistics to be reported to the council within 3 months of the end of September of each year:

- a) the total number of code of conduct complaints made about councillors and the general manager under the code of conduct in the year to September (the reporting period)*
- b) the number of code of conduct complaints referred to a conduct reviewer during the reporting period*
- c) the number of code of conduct complaints finalised by a conduct reviewer at the preliminary assessment stage during the reporting period and the outcome of those complaints*
- d) the number of code of conduct complaints investigated by a conduct reviewer during the reporting period*

e) without identifying particular matters, the outcome of investigations completed under these procedures during the reporting period

f) the number of matters reviewed by the Office during the reporting period and, without identifying particular matters, the outcome of the reviews, and

g) the total cost of dealing with code of conduct complaints made about councillors and the general manager during the reporting period, including staff costs.

11.2 The council is to provide the Office with a report containing the statistics referred to in clause 11.1 within 3 months of the end of September of each year.

The report has been prepared in accordance with these provisions and is attached (Attachment 1) for information.

2. Comparison with Previous Reporting Period (1 September 2019 to 31 August 2020)

The number of Code of Conduct complaints received during the current reporting period is Nil, compared to two (2) for the 2019/20 period.

By way of comparison, the costs incurred through the administration of the Code of Conduct were Nil, the same as the 2019/20 reporting period.
